BIOGRAPHICAL NOTE

Constantine Bozinis studied Theology, Philosophy and Ancient History at the Universities of Thessaloniki, Heidelberg and Paris (Sorbonne IV). In 2000 he was unanimously awarded a doctoral degree by the Faculty of Theology of Aristotle University of Thessaloniki with distinction. He worked as a scientific collaborator at the Patriarchal Institute for Patristic Studies (1997-1999) and at the Pedagogical Institute of the Hellenic Ministry of Education (2001-2006). He taught as an Associate Professor at the Superior Ecclesiastical Academy of Athens (2006-2009) and since 2009 he holds the Chair of Ancient and Byzantine Philosophy at the School of Social Theology & Christian Culture of the Faculty of Theology of Aristotle University of Thessaloniki. He has authored, among other works, the monograph "Johannes Chrysostomus über das Imperium Romanum: Studium zum politischen Denken der Alten Kirche", as well as a number of articles dealing with the philosophical background and the political ideas present in John Chrysostom's rhetoric. His interests also extend to mystical theology, apocryphal literature of the Bible and the relations between Hellenism and Christianity. He has organized various international conferences over the last few years in Thessaloniki, and is the director of the Cinematography Club of the School of Social Theology & Christian Culture, where he has been teaching since 2009.
